Development of the Trauma and Resilience Informed training for community organizations and their staff, the Food Policy Council, and implementation of the Fresno HOPE Pathways Community HUB, an evidencebased whole person care coordination model.



Partnering with Assemblymember Dr. Joaquin Arambula and CACHI to include a one-time budget line item of \$15 million in the Governor's 2023 budget for California Accountable Communities for Health Initiative (CACHI) to fund current CACHI sites, such as FCHIP, and 36 new ACHs throughout California.
